Host a Cleanup

Every year, the City promotes "Earth Week" cleanups the week of April 22. This year, **Earth Week is Saturday, April 15 to Sunday, April 23**. If you're interested in hosting a neighborhood, park, or alley cleanup, register yours online at www.troyny.gov/1331/Earth-Day. If you host a cleanup, you can opt-in to pick-up the following items to distribute/use:

Pick-up at City Hall (Monday through Friday, 8:30am to 4:30pm):

- Clear recycling/trash bags
- Textile program magnets
- Recycling bin stickers
- Deterra pharmaceutical disposal bags

Schedule a pick-up at Knickerbacker Arena (Monday through Friday, 9am to 2pm):

- Leaf bags

Battery Recycling Program

Drop-offs at City Hall and the Department of Public Works

We are excited to announce a pilot battery recycling drop-off program! We are offering this service starting mid-April. To make sure your batteries are eligible for disposal, use the [Battery Identification List](#).

Drop-off locations:

- **City Hall**, 433 River Street, Suite 5001 (Mayor's Office).
Monday - Friday, 8:30am to 4:30pm
- **Department of Public Works**, 3118 7th Avenue.
Monday - Friday, 7:30am to 2:30pm

The following battery types are accepted in our pilot program:

• Alkaline	• Mercury Batteries
• Zinc Carbon	• Silver Oxide
• Nickel Cadmium	• Button Cells
• Lithium-Ion	• Lead Acid - Non-Spillable
• Lithium Primary	

Directions: tape the battery's terminals (ends) with **clear tape** and drop them into the bucket!
