Household Hazardous Waste

We've covered it before, and we're doing it again. This is Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Crash Course 101! What falls under this category? Why are special disposal days required? Do I really have to wait to get rid of my old paints?

The Basics of HHW

Household hazardous waste, or **HHW** for short, is a category of items that are:

- corrosive
- flammable
- and/or toxic ☣

if thrown out in your regular garbage, they can harm our Sanitation team, the environment, and do damage to our trucks! These special events help keep our planet and people safe! Once the materials at the event are collected, our HHW vendor uses several methods, including recycling, remixing, and fuel creation to safely recover and/or dispose of them.

Some examples of household hazardous materials are: gasoline, pesticides/chemicals, mercury, and fire extinguishers. A complete list of items is available at www.troyny.gov/hhw.

While we accept paints and paint-related products at our HHW disposal events, they can be recycled through the NYS PaintCare program **year-round**. **PaintCare** is a nonprofit organization that encourages the recycling of paint and related products. New York State adopted their program in 2022 to make the recovery of paint more convenient for businesses, organizations and individuals. Reusable Bags

In 2021, we started distributing reusable bags to community organizations, nonprofits, and Troy residents. These bags are purchased with funding from New York State's disposable bag tax, where non-reusable bags cost five cents at most retail stores.

We just distributed our latest bag design - "Staying Cool in Troy NY" to food pantries throughout the City. This go around, we secured reusable cooler bags! This will help keep any grocery items the pantries provide cool and fresh in the hotter months. Once all the food pantries, community organizations, and nonprofits receive their bags, we will start giving them out at City Hall. Stay tuned!

Drop-offs at City Hall and the Department of Public Works

We are excited to announce a pilot battery recycling drop-off program! We are offering this service starting mid-April. To make sure your batteries are eligible for disposal, use the [Battery Identification List](#).

- **Department of Public Works**, 3118 7th Avenue.
Monday - Friday, 7:30am to 2:30pm

The following battery types are accepted in our pilot program:

• Alkaline	• Mercury Batteries
• Zinc Carbon	• Silver Oxide
• Nickel Cadmium	• Button Cells
• Lithium-Ion	• Lead Acid - Non-Spillable
• Lithium Primary	

Directions: tape the battery's terminals (ends) with **clear tape** and drop them into the bucket!
