Why Aren't These Items Recyclable Curbside?

Ceramics:


Ceramics include plates, cups, glasses and other dishes. These may seem recyclable (they are kind of like glass, right?) but they are not accepting in your curbside recycling bin. If they are still usable/in good condition, donate them or sell them! If not, sadly they must be thrown out. Wrap them in paper or plastic to reduce the likelihood of them ripping through your garbage bag.

Paper Receipts:

You might be asking yourself, "why in the world can't I recycle paper receipts? They're paper!" Well, they may be paper, but they're different than what's in your printer. The ink used on paper receipts is also special. Paper receipts should be kept with your other household garbage. We suggest going paperless wherever and whenever possible!

Window glass, glass cups, and wine glasses:

Here's another one - window glass, glass cups, and wine glasses. While glass items like bottles and glass jars can be recycled in your blue curbside bin, these other kinds of glass are manufactured at a different temperature and therefore can't be. If any of these are still in usable condition, try donating them! Window glass could be a great help to a non-profit who specializes in construction, while glasses and cups could do great at a secondhand store.
