








HOUSATONIC RIVER WALK



Simultaneous with Stanley's endeavor, heiress Mary Sherwood Dresser had an Edison direct current system installed in her new Kellogg Terrace on South Main Street, and provided power to numerous businesses. Thus the town witnessed a skirmish in what became a major battle of the currents. Stanley's competitor George Westinghouse and a consortium prevailed. Stanley went to establish a manufacturing facility in Pittsfield in the 1890s, which evolved into General Electric. Ironically a later innovation in power transformer production involved polychlorinated biphenols (PCBs), reckless handling and disposal of which returned in major contamination of the river. Stanley returned to Great Barrington in 1898 and built a factory on Church Street to make electric wares and, later, all-metal, insulated Stanley bottles (which are still produced under the Aladdin brand today). This Stanley Overlook, a tribute to the community's industrial heritage, was dedicated in June 2006.


